



Put drawing papers in your folder and put folder in **purple basket.**

The cloud with the line through it means this image is NOT downloaded to your school account. You can be selective in what you download.



You want to click Back Up so it gets added to your school photo library.



When an image is downloaded to your account you will see the cloud with a line symbol had gone away.
